#### Background

The Atlantic-Arctic Distributed Biological Observatory (<u>A-DBO</u>) is a collaborative ocean observing network for climate and environment in the Atlantic sector of the Arctic Ocean - one of the key gateway areas of the Arctic, currently experiencing rapid environmental, climate and ecosystem changes. Together, the pioneering observatory in the Pacific sector of the Arctic Ocean (DBO), the Baffin Bay/Davis Strait DBO, the East Siberian Sea DBO, and the A-DBO work to contribute with significant components to the pan-Arctic observational network.

The open annual Autumn meeting serves to gather the multidisciplinary A-DBO community for exchange of knowledge about the marine ecosystem functioning and for sharing information regarding observations undertaken in 2023 and planned for 2024/25.
